Who we are

Basmeh & Zeitooneh was established in September 2012, conducting on-site visits to regions hosting significant populations of the most vulnerable and destitute Syrian refugees. After only a year of hard work and planning, in February 2014 Basmeh & Zeitooneh became an officially registered organization in Lebanon under decree #145/2014. In 2023, the Basmeh & Zeitooneh organization employed more than two hundred full-time staff and field members.

About Us

Basmeh & Zeitooneh started as a grassroots organization in 2012 when a group of volunteers in Lebanon – driven by the plight of Syrian refugees – began a small relief operation.

Today, Basmeh & Zeitooneh has grown into one of the largest and most established refugee-led relief organizations in the world. Working in four countries, we respond to the acute needs of both the displaced and their host communities.

We help people reclaim dignity and agency over their lives.



Our Community Centers

Presently, we operate four community centers in Lebanon. These centers were established to provide a focal point for Syrian refugees and vulnerable communities in marginalized regions. They serve as places where individuals can directly access assistance, obtain information, and acquire skills that generate income. Successfully, Basmeh & Zeitooneh has served approximately 49,768 individuals and 6,780 households across all regions of Lebanon. Moreover, our centers serve as vital local hubs for informal education, addressing the learning requirements of 2500 children through diverse programs.
